Capital Humane Society Opens New Stransky Veterinary Center!

In late August of 2023, Capital Humane Society announced plans to construct and open its newest location, the Stransky Veterinary Center. The Stransky Veterinary Center is Capital Humane Society's third location in Lincoln in addition to the Admissions & Assessment Center and the Pieloch Pet Adoption Center.

Over the past couple of years, the number of pets, specifically canines, coming to the shelter has drastically increased. For canines, intake levels have returned to levels not seen since 2012. Inflation and other factors have led to more pets being surrendered to the shelter too. Additionally, more pet owners are unable to provide their pets with basic veterinary wellness care and get their pets spayed/neutered due to rising costs at veterinary clinics. Because of these issues, Capital Humane Society determined the Stransky Veterinary Center was desperately needed in the Lincoln and Lancaster County community.

The Stransky Veterinary Center provides all pet owners in the community with access to affordable preventative veterinary care, spay/neuter services, and pet dental care regardless of their income. The clinic offers preventative veterinary care like vaccinations, heartworm testing, flea/ tick preventative, heartworm preventative, microchips, and deworming. Pet owners are also able to get their pets spayed/neutered, so they do not reproduce and contribute to the pet homelessness issue with unwanted litters of puppies or kittens. And pet dental care including teeth cleanings and extractions, which is an often overlooked aspect of taking care of a pet.

The clinic offers two price structures including reduced pricing for incomequalified pet owners who receive some form of government assistance (Medicaid, SNAP, WIC, etc.). Those who are not incomequalified can also access the clinic for services at very affordable prices.

Ultimately, the number of homeless pets ending up at the shelter must change and the shelter can't continue to operate at or near capacity for pets. To accomplish this, more pets need to be spayed/neutered and provided preventative care to avoid illnesses or diseases that pet owners can't afford to treat. The Stransky Veterinary Center is the gamechanger to make this possible in our community.

The Stransky Veterinary Center is located at 5505 0 Street Suite 1 & 2 in the middle of Lincoln so it is easily accessible to all community members. The clinic operates Monday-Friday each week from 8:00am-4:00pm. For more information or to book an appointment, visit StranskyVeterinaryCenter.org.

If you could add one thing to the Lincoln Animal Ambassadors "wish list," what would it be? I would add cat toys for the cats to play with and soft beds for the dogs and cats who need them.

Social Media Guru
