LAA assists with vaccinations

On August 23, Lincoln Animal Ambassadors initiated a program running through the end of 2021 to pay \$20 per vaccination needed for the spay/ neuter procedure for pets that have been issued a voucher through our incomebased Spay/Neuter Assistance Program, LAA's cornerstones for combating pet overpopulation.

To request a spay/neuter voucher for your pet, and to take advantage of this limited time offer for necessary vaccinations, just submit a voucher request on LAA's website or leave a message on LAA's voicemail. An LAA volunteer will respond to the call to get the information necessary to issue a voucher if you are not able to request the voucher online.

Once the voucher is received, it is the recipient's responsibility to make an appointment with a participating veterinary clinic and to bring their pet to the veterinarian's office.

LAA's Pet Food Bank has moved!

Lincoln Animal Ambassadors is excited to announce that it has moved its pet food bank to a new facility. Their new space is at 300 Oak Creek Drive, where LAA will have a much larger warehouse.

LAA's pet food bank space has increased from 700 square feet to 2100 square feet. According to LAA's president and co-founder Mary Douglas, not only will the space make it easier to store and distribute pet food to those in need, but it'll allow LAA to take advantage of opportunities that it hasn't been able to in the past due to limited space.

The move was a major project, and LAA appreciates its volunteers who helped with the move. LAA is a 501(c)3 non-profit run completely by volunteers. "It took the time and generosity of a good number of volunteers to pull it off. Our volunteers are vital to our existence and the good that we do in the community," said Douglas.

Featured Rescue: LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs

No matter what people are going through, there always seems to be something that will instantly bring a smile to their face. Lutheran Church Charities and its welltrained golden retrievers, referred to as the LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs, do just that by being present during all situations. People often drop to their knees to absorb the gentle, furry presence of the Comfort Dogs that brings joy and calmness when they need it the most.

When invited, LCC's K-9 Comfort Dogs serve at church events, school visits, chapel talks, school and library reading programs, nursing homes, hospitals, and community events, to name a few.

For over ten years, LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs have been deployed to serve those affected and the community after mass shootings. Also, the losses of loved ones and property can overwhelm the survivors of natural disasters. The presence of LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs brings friendship, love, and comfort during difficult times. In crisis or disaster situations, LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs serve families, first responders, and the community affected by tragic events.

Lutheran Church Charities (LCC) is a faith-based ministry with a mission to share the Mercy, Compassion, Presence and Proclamation of Jesus Christ to those who are suffering and in need. Headquartered in Northbrook, Illinois, LCC never charges those we serve!

130 LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs are present in 27 states and seven are in Nebraska.

The purpose of a comfort dog is to interact with people of all ages and circumstances. Together with their ministry teams, LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs are good listeners, nonjudgmental and confidential. Many people will talk to a comfort dog before talking to people to process the stress or grief that they are experiencing.

Since 2012, when the first LCC K-9 Comfort Dog was placed in Nebraska, many Nebraska teams have responded to ten national crisis or disaster situations. In March 2021, Comfort Dogs Joanna, Priscilla, Eddie, Katie, and their teams responded to the King Soopers Store mass shooting in Boulder, Colorado, to comfort those impacted by this tragedy.

Meet LCC K-9 Comfort Dog Joanna

Joanna Comfort Dog and her handlers stay busy with regular monthly visits in the Lincoln community and surrounding area. She comforts people in hospice care and at the cancer center, and shares love

with her friends at assisted living, memory care, skilled nursing, long-term care, and rehabilitation facilities. Sisters in different facilities-one in hospice care and one in assisted living-were connected by their love for each other and mutual love for Joanna Comfort Dog. She always made them smile. Their voices would exclaim, "Oooh Joanna! You are so sweet, pretty, and soft." Handlers took pictures of each sister with Joanna and framed photos for their rooms. These sisters were touched by a shared love for Joanna, as are so many of her friends she visits! At Christ Lincoln Schools and schools throughout the state, Joanna Comfort Dog meets students of all ages at their special events or in times of crisis. Christ Lincoln congregation members enjoy seeing her at church services and activities.

Joanna Comfort Dog and her ministry team have traveled for national deployments to Highlands Ranch, Colorado; El Paso, Texas; Ft. Dodge, Iowa; and Boulder, Colorado.

Meet LCC K-9 Comfort Dog Priscilla

Priscilla Comfort Dog and her handlers enjoy weekly and monthly visits throughout Lincoln and nearby communities. Visits with the Lincoln Police Department

and the 911 dispatch office are always a special time to thank them for their protection and service. She also visits the Child Advocacy Center twice a month to comfort children and family members in the court system who have experienced trauma. Priscilla's snuggles help them go through the investigation and healing process. Other regular visits include grief support groups, memory units, assisted living facilities, schools, senior centers, and daycare centers. Priscilla brings extra love when attending visitations and funerals, especially for the sudden loss of young lives. She loves her work with special needs children and teens by attending Respite Care events and Tim Tebow's Night to Shine. Priscilla Comfort Dog and her ministry team have deployed nationally for the California wildfires and two shootings in Colorado, most recently in Boulder.

It's been a strange couple of years. The pandemic has made us learn to live differently and be grateful for things we took for granted before. And with that, LAA has had to learn to do things differently also. Our biggest adjustments are no contact distribution at the pet food bank and not being able to hold our annual fundraisers as we normally would, plus many other procedures that have changed.

Why are we grateful? Because there is no *us* without *you!* Your overwhelming generosity helps us to support the vital work we do in Lancaster County. For 13 years LAA has addressed the root causes of animal homelessness. We have assisted approximately 175 families throughout 2021 distributing over 21,000 pounds of dry pet food this year, over 15,500 cans of pet food, over 4,200 pounds of cat litter and other pet related items and we have continued our work spaying and neutering Lincoln pets totaling 3,427 spay/neuter procedures during our existence.

LAA would like to thank all of the corporate donors that have donated to the pet food bank this year. We would also like to extend thanks to all the individuals who dropped donations in our donation bins around town. Every little bit adds up to a lot and that is how LAA's pet food bank has worked for 13 years. We can't do this without all of you!

The recipient should contact the veterinary office of their choice to let them know they have an LAA voucher and confirm that it will be accepted by them. Check LAA's website for a current listing of clinics that accept our vouchers. LAA's vouchers are issued for a given amount that reduces the final spay/neuter cost. The amount is based on many different factors such as the age and size of the animal being altered. Similar to a coupon, all costs beyond the issued value of the voucher are the recipients responsibility. But through this promotion, LAA is covering \$20 per any vaccine the pet needs to perform the spay/neuter procedure.

One of the reasons that participating vets

work with LAA is they believe in the benefits of spaying and neutering animals. Along with this procedure, most veterinarians also offer a variation of other preventative care, again because they believe in its importance. A final reason given by the veterinarians I talked with, is the desire to give back to the community.

If you know of a pet that needs to be spayed or neutered and vaccinated, now is a perfect time to contact LAA to see if they qualify for a voucher. From now running through the end of 2021, each spay/ neuter voucher will cover \$20/per required vaccination up to two vaccinations for each cat and up to three vaccinations for each dog.

LAA is also entirely supported by donations and fundraisers. Unfortunately, LAA has not been able to have its normal annual fundraisers over the past two years due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
