LAA acquires new power pallet jack for Pet Food Bank

Earlier this year, after helping to manually unload several pallets of pet food donations, one of our pet food bank volunteers asked if we had ever considered getting a power jack/lift for unloading and moving pet food pallets in our warehouse. For 16 years, LAA has counted on great volunteers to come and help load and unload pet food manually. As years have gone by, we have all gotten older and most of the volunteers that help with this heavy physical job are women.

Lucky for LAA, that inquiring volunteer, Colleen Kadavy, had connections with WoodmenLife Lincoln, which is a group of people who have policies through WoodmenLife. Colleen asked the WoodmenLife Lincoln Chapter 264 to pledge \$3,700 toward the purchase of a power machine that would alleviate a lot

of the physical labor when a truck or trailer of pallets needed to be unloaded. Colleen herself added \$200 to that total.

So, along with Colleen, we were on a mission to find a machine that would work for LAA, but we had some challenges. Our warehouse has a fairly low suspended ceiling and we had a few ramp and door height issues. We worked with Nolan Osburn and Mike Munson, Jr. at Riekes Equipment and after a couple of options we found just the right fit, but at a price. Riekes Equipment loved our mission and gave us a hefty discount. But, once the suggestion had come to light, we realized we needed this piece of machinery to allow us to continue to do what we do for the pets of low-income families in Lancaster County.

On June 20th, Rieke's Equipment delivered a new Vestil Power Stacker to our warehouse. We can't thank Nolan and Mike at Rieke's enough for their hard work in searching out the machine that would fit our needs.

Rescue Spotlight: **Voice for Companion** Animals

Voice for Companion Animals is an allvolunteer nonprofit located in Grand Island, NE. VCA was originally started in Beatrice by our rescue friend Gayla Hausman. She donated her time and efforts to providing pet food and supplies quarterly to those pet owners in need. In 2014, Voice for Companion Animals moved to Grand Island, under new Director Robyn Mays. Robyn's rescue experience and knowledge of the central Nebraska area, brought the existing mission, to assist pet owners in keeping their pets at home, as well as expanding the resources, and a facility, into an animal rescue that continues today.

Voice for Companion Animals started in Grand Island by providing food for the pet food pantry at the Salvation Army. In 2015, the AniMeals program was created, in conjunction with the Grand Generation Center. This program provided pet food and supplies for those individuals on the Home Based Meal program. VCA has grown from approximately 18 families to approximately 40 assisted each month, including delivering to other counties. VCA also maintains a pet food pantry at the facility in Grand Island.

On the rescue side, Voice for Companion Animals averages between 20 and 40 animals cared for by volunteers at their facility. These dogs and cats come from veterinary referrals, to owner surrenders, to those from other local and overcrowded shelters. These companion animals have no other place to go.

In 2022, as the need for assistance continued, the Happy Tails Fund was established. The creation of the Happy Tails Fund, in conjunction with the Greater Grand Island Community Foundation, assists those pet parents in an emergency. To date, the Happy Tails Fund has assisted with over two dozen emergencies ranging from broken limbs, emergency spays, eye removal and parvo treatment.

Volunteers are the key to the success of VCA. VCA's volunteers are the most amazing and dedicated people who give their time and talents each day to ensure the animals are safe and loved until their forever homes are found. And Voice for Companion Animals continues to grow and thrive with the generous donations and sponsorships of our supporters. That is how we continue to be funded today.

Volunteer Spotlight: **Riah Engel**

Where did you first learn about Lincoln Animal Ambassadors?

I first learned about LAA during a tabling event at my college. I have always had a passion for helping animals and wanted to make a difference locally, so I decided to stop and chat with the representatives. Tell us a little bit about yourself.

My academic focus is to expand my experiences as an undergraduate student so I will have opportunities in graduate school. I am actively involved in several research labs that explore many topics, such as mental health, rehabilitation, and law and policy. My goal is to enter graduate school and earn a doctorate in psychology, with a particular emphasis on criminal psychology. In addition to my academic pursuits, I am currently working as a crisis counselor on a hotline, helping people with their mental health. This role has further strengthened my desire to help make a difference in the lives of others.

What areas do you primarily volunteer for at this time?

I currently volunteer as a phone volunteer for LAA. I take on all calls one day a week, every week. My responsibilities include responding to messages and ensuring clients can get their animals spayed or neutered. Additionally, I help set up arrangements for the pet food bank, making sure that owners can get scheduled for their pets in need to receive the necessary supplies. Through this role, I am able to contribute to the welfare of animals in our community and support pet owners in providing the best care for their furry friends.

What do you find rewarding in your volunteer activities?

What I find most rewarding about my volunteer activities is the genuine happiness and fulfillment they bring me. I have a strong desire to help people, and I



firmly believe

in the power of volunteering and giving back to the community. Knowing that my efforts contribute to the well-being of both animals and their owners fills me with a sense of purpose and joy. Each call I handle and each pet I help support reminds me of the positive impact we can have when we come together to support one another.

What would you recommend to anyone looking to volunteer for LAA?

I would highly recommend volunteering for the LAA. Volunteering is such a rewarding experience, and being part of LAA is an incredible opportunity. The community is welcoming and supportive, and you can make a meaningful impact by helping people and preventing animal homelessness. LAA's 16th Annual Wine & Howl raises \$13,000!

\$13,000 was raised at the 16th annual Wine & Howl to support Lincoln Animal Ambassadors' spay/neuter program and pet food bank. Over 400 people, 150-200 dogs, and one cat (in a pet stroller) attended the fundraising event at Deer Springs Winery. From 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, June 9th, patrons enjoyed shady fresh air and live music. Karl Skinner emceed the event.

For a second year in a row, the AM/ FM band entertained crowds. Lead singer Jayden was unable to be there and so her dad Bryan Olesen, straight from his recent appearance and third place win on the national TV show "The Voice", stepped in to take her place. "He was so kind and friendly with everyone there and did a stupendous job," said LAA president Mary Douglas.

As in previous years, Hy-Vee offered a variety of food options and Deer Springs Winery had their wine tent set up, along with their wine slushies! Free pup cakes were donated by PAW BAKERY.

Attendees had the opportunity to visit with twenty-four vendors, consisting of petrelated and non pet-related companies as well as shelter and rescue groups. Sixtythree themed gift baskets were raffled consisting of pet related raffle baskets, kid activity baskets, small plant gardens, baker related baskets and several wine baskets.

Twenty-five volunteers were on site to help make Wine & Howl a success plus several additional volunteers that helped in preparation behind the scenes.

"LAA is just so appreciative of the community support of our mission year after year attending this event," said Douglas. "We're so grateful that our community believes in our mission enough to continue their support. Thank you Lincoln!"
